Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time † Luke 12:13-21

In today's Gospel, Jesus is seen as a rabbi (or teacher) and is asked to settle a disagreement. A man asks him to "tell my brother to share the inheritance with me," and Jesus tells a parable about a rich man who is really concerned about saving lots of material wealth – as security against hard times. Jesus wants people to understand that in God's eyes, true security is found in spiritual, not material wealth. For if we give most of our attention to material things, we don't "see" the needs of people around us, and therefore, don't try to help them.

This gospel tells us to avoid greed in all its forms. Where do you find greed in your daily life? How do you overcome it? God tells the rich man that his life will be demanded of him. What demands on your life does God make? How do you respond?

ST. THERESE TRIVIA

In March, 1964, Betty Susnjara and Alice Shackleford co-chaired what we remember as the first St. Patrick's Day parish dinner. We don't recall if this fund-raiser was continued or for how many years.

At that time the Parish Hall was in the basement of the school, where the 7th and 8th grade classrooms are now located. The kitchen was barely operable.

The main ham dish was prepared in the Home Economics kitchen at nearby Marycrest High School and had to be shuttled from there to the parish on a continuous basis by volunteers in cars throughout the dinner hours. The coleslaw was prepared at Yaw's Drive-In in the Hollywood district. The red potatoes were donated by a generous farmer. It all came together and was a financial success! Marko and Betty Susnjara
