Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time † Luke 12:32-48

In this reading from the Gospel of Luke, Jesus teaches us that no one knows when the second coming will happen. He also tells us that we need to be ready for that great event — the arrival of the Lord of Glory at the end of time. To “be ready,” Jesus tells us, means that we shouldn’t pay too much attention to “material” things. But, we should be responsible for what we do and show our love for the Lord by doing things that help others. It is this loving service that keeps us connected to the Lord until he comes. ***What are some examples of Jesus’ “loving service” that we can also do? What are some activities/programs/events that our families and communities can be involved in? It’s been a very long time since Jesus told his disciples that He would come again.
