Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time □ Luke 9:51-62

Jesus is on his way to Jerusalem. He forgives the Samaritans who refuse to welcome him, showing his disciples how to behave toward their enemies. He then responds to three different people who want to follow him. Jesus tells them right up front the high cost of becoming his disciple. That cost may include giving up home, family and means of income.

Imagine Jesus saying to you, "Come follow me now, without delay." What would be your first concern? What is it like for you to follow Jesus? Do you have to give anything up?

St. Therese Trivia

This is part of an article that was adapted from an article in The Parkrose Enterprise, January 8, 1964 that appears in the St. Therese History book:

" The building (MPC) was originally designed in 1957 by the John W. Maloney Co. of Seattle for a multi-purpose structure for church and school use. No funds were available at that time for its construction. The building was redesigned for church use exclusively by the same firm and will be used at a later date for a school hall and social purposes.

The nave of the new building is 60 x 100 feet. There is an additional area of 22 x 80 feet, which will serve as nursery facilities, or for a bride's room during weddings or requiem room for funeral use. Contract price for the new building is \$100,465.00, furnishings additional. A. C. Schommer is the general contractor."
