✠ 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time ✠ Luke 15:1-32 ✠

In today's gospel reading, Jesus tells three parables, or stories, which show us how eager God is to find us when we stray. When we fail to treat other people the way Jesus did, God is still willing to welcome us home. As in the story of the Prodigal Son, God rushes toward us with love, compassion, and forgiveness. Actually, God's love and forgiveness are almost too much to be believed. It is just about impossible for us to offer forgiveness and reconciliation on this grand of a scale -- or is it? This is the challenge each of us faces.

What can we learn from these three parables? Why does God rush toward us with such loving compassion? Are you able to forgive and reconcile with those people who have hurt you? Why or why not?

ST. THERESE TRIVIA

Father Louis Urbanski came to St. Therese Parish as pastor in summer, 1988, after four years as principal of Valley Catholic High School in Beaverton. During his 12 years here, this dedicated educator directed the beginning of the kindergarten program, the inauguration of the annual St. Therese school auction events, and the fund drive and building program which accomplished an extensive remodeling and upgrade of school facilities and the building of the long-awaited Parish Social center.

When we asked him for reminiscences of his at St. Therese, he graciously responded:

At another time, a group of young people in a Ford Bronco was tearing up the turf in the field. A parishioner (some say closely resembling a former pastor) took off in hot pursuit of the culprits down 132nd. They turned west on Glisan (their way east blocked by the "wanna be" patrol officer). Their car did not have their lights on, and lo and behold, a police car coming up Glisan saw them, made a U-turn and chased them. They were stopped after a short chase and "taken care of" to the great joy and satisfaction of "wanna be" vindicator. Ah, what delight!! What pure revenge!!!
